COMMUNITY UPDATE

Recent Happenings

The Washington State Board of Health (Board) met on <u>October 9, 2023</u> (watch the <u>full meeting)</u> in Wenatchee:

- Members received an <u>update</u> from the <u>Chelan-Douglas Health</u> <u>District</u>. The update discussed the population served by the District, its programs and services, challenges, and future direction.
- Members voted to initiate rulemaking for <u>Chapter 246-650 WAC</u> to add <u>two conditions</u> to the newborn screening panel.

The Board also met on <u>November 8, 2023</u> (watch the <u>full meeting</u>) in Tumwater:

- The Board announced the appointment of <u>Member Hayes</u> as new Board Chair, replacing outgoing Member Grellner. <u>Paj Nandi</u> is joining the Board, filling the role of "<u>a person with background in</u> <u>Health and Sanitation</u>".
- Each year the Board reviews its <u>legislative statement</u>. The purpose of the legislative statement is to guide staff activities on priority topics during the legislative session. They did not take any action during this meeting. The Board will review and adopt its statement at the January 10, 2024, meeting.
- Part of the Board's <u>strategic plan</u> is to monitor the health effects of climate change. The Board hosted a storytelling panel to engage and learn how climate change is impacting Tribes and <u>communities</u> <u>that are overburdened</u> in Washington state. The panel consisted of four members; Elaine Harvey, Watershed Department Manager, <u>Columbia River Inter-Tribal Fish Commission</u> (presentation); Paulina Lopez, Executive Director, <u>Duwamish River Community Coalition</u> (presentation); Ryan Oelrich, Executive Director, <u>Priority Spokane & Spokane City Council Member (presentation); Sue Sullivan, Environmental Health Manager, Whatcom County Health Department (presentation).

<u>Committee</u> met on December 15. Committee Members previewed upcoming Board meeting agenda items and heard updates on rulemaking projects, including Sanitary Control of Shellfish.

The <u>Health Promotion Committee</u> met on December 7 and received an informational briefing on Oral Health Equity in Washington, along with a Legislative Session check in and updates on current rulemaking.

The Subcommittees will hold meetings for 2024 on the first Thursday of the month (Health Promotion) and the second Thursday of the month (Environmental Health).

GOVERNOR'S INTERAGENCY COUNCIL ON HEALTH DISPARITIES

The <u>Governor's Interagency Council on Health Disparities</u> held a meeting on December 14, 2023, at the Tukwila Community Center. The agenda and materials are <u>located here</u>.

The Council is an interagency workgroup responsible for creating a state policy action plan and recommendations to eliminate health inequities by race/ethnicity and gender in Washington. The State Board of Health is a member of the Council. The Board also supports the Governor by providing operational support to the Council.

Since last year, the Council has focused on a redesign project that could change the Council's name, purpose, membership, and responsibilities. The Council connected with governmental and community partners to learn how the Council could lead or support unified goals for optimal health and wellbeing. Partners have offered insight on how to better engage communities as well as align with partners' priorities to address health inequities and advance health justice and equity. In October 2023, the Council submitted a redesign proposal to the Governor's Office for consideration and it is currently under review. Revising the Council's statute and operating budget would also require action by state lawmakers during the legislative session.
